PRIMARY PROGRAM AREAS:

RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT

- Passed through \$907,000 to youth corps for conservation work projects.
- Provided land managers with 124 weeks of youth corps crews.
- Passed through \$93,000 to youth corps to support low-income outreach activities.

TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE AND TRAINING

- Accredited 10 youth corps.
- Implemented health and wellness pilot curriculum and evaluation.
- Provided training to 60 crewleaders in technical skills, corpsmember development, leadership and environmental education skills.
- Coordinated an AmeriCorps VISTA volunteer program and placed 30 VISTA members at 25 youth corps and nonprofits statewide.
- Launched a Green Collar Jobs Initiative addressing education and employment needs of TANF-eligible and low-income youth and young adults.
- Supported statewide youth corps participation of 1,800 youth and young adults.

EDUCATION PARTNERSHIPS

- Distributed \$211,000 in AmeriCorps Education Awards to 178 corpsmembers.
- · Coordinated partnerships with community colleges for college credits to corpsmembers.
