YOUTH SCHOLARSHIPS FOR COLLEGE AND TRADE SCHOOLS

CYCA and youth corps have distributed over half a million dollars in AmeriCorps Education Awards to 335 young adults and veterans statewide. Many of these vouchers support tuition at Colorado colleges or reduce existing student loan debt of participants.

CYCA engaged in strategic communication on behalf of corps. This communication includes conducting presentations at state and national conferences, to statewide boards and commissions, and testifying before elected officials and conservation decision-makers.
